RESOURCE REFERRALS

NAME: Macomb's Access to Resource Information Xpress (MATRIX)

DESCRIPTION Macomb's Access to Resource Information Xpress (MATRIX) is a computer program designed to help Macomb individuals and families identify their health and human service needs and connect them with local services.

Individuals complete an online questionnaire to indicate their unique situation (i.e., senior citizen, veteran, etc.) and their need/s (utility assistance, health care, food, etc.). Once the questionnaire is completed, MATRIX sends an e-mail to the participating HSCB member health and human service agencies.

The MATRIX questionnaire is available in English, Spanish, Arabic, Bengali, and has the capacity for persons with visual impairments to use with the Job Access with Speech for the Visually Impaired (JAWS) screen reader.

In the building, the kiosk is located near the front door.

In the building, the kiosks are located near Veteran Services and the WIC office.

In the building, the kiosk is located in the main office. Ask at the front desk.

NAME: New MI Bridges Access to Resources

DESCRIPTION

The Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) offers an online access to community resources through their New MI Bridges website: newMIBridges.michigan.gov The search for services function is linked to 2-1-1. Individuals/agencies who would like to use the Access to Resources directory **do not** have to be a DHHS client.

IF YOU/YOUR CLIENT/YOUR AGENCY IS NOT REGISTERED WITH 2-1-1, YOU CAN ONLY SEE LIMITED RESOURCES _____

To access the limited resources, go to newMIBridges.michigan.gov and then click on the "Explore Resources" button at the top of the page. Then scroll down to the section "Want to explore resources without creating an account?" Then click on the service category you want information about.

HOW TO BECOME A COMMUNITY PARTNER WITH NEW MI BRIDGES ACCESS TO BECOME ONE OF THEIR SERVICE LISTINGS _____

Organizations which provide services to communities can receive electronic referrals through the new MI Bridges Access to Resources after registering with New MI Bridges.

But before you can register with New MI Bridges to become a Community Partner , your agency must first be registered with 2-1-1.

To register with 2-1-1, complete and send back the 2-1-1 application posted at <http://www.mi211.org/about-us/document-library/agency-information-form>

Troubleshooting: MiBridges brings up "matches" that appear in 2-1-1, and asks you to select the correct one. If it doesn't find a match, you need to figure out where the discrepancy is and start over. In one case, the agency needed to change their location from "Clinton Township" to "Charter Township of Clinton" on their application.

HOW TO REGISTER WITH MIBRIDGES

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Once your agency becomes a 2-1-1 community partner, you are expected to log in every day to get referrals. You will get a new login code each time you log in that will be sent to you via e-mail or text.

TO REGISTER WITH THE NEW MI BRIDGES TO ACCESS ALL THE RESOURCES _____

1. Go to newMIBridges.michigan.gov
2. Click on the “Register” button
3. Complete your personal information
4. You may skip the Social Security number and Medicaid number
5. Answer the “Robot” questions
6. Click on the “Terms and Conditions” box
7. Click on the “Next” button
8. Verify your address
9. Select a user name and password
10. Answer the security questions and click on “Next.”

TO USE NEW MI BRIDGES AND ACCESS ALL THE RESOURCES _____

1. Go to newMIBridges.michigan.gov
2. On the navigation bar to the right, click on “I want to . . .” and then at the top of the page , click on “Explore Resources”
3. Type in the resource needed in the “All Topics” and the “All Subcategories” and a list of resources will automatically pop up. If you do not enter something in the “All Subcategories,” no resources will pop up.

NAME	Project Amos email group
DESCRIPTION	Project Amos is a free email group provided by Trinity Lutheran Church in Utica which sends out email messages to members about donated items (usually free) available for the needy in the community. The agency/person who wants to items contacts the donor (not Project Amos) and must pick up the item/s at the donors specificity.
TO JOIN	Send an email request with the words "Project Amos" in the subject line to: Jenny Jaroneski, projectamos@trinityutica.com

Use the "Project Amos" e-mail group to:

- **Learn about items (usually furniture or appliances, medical equipment, etc.) that individuals or families may have for free if they pick it up. The Project Amos group only links the donor with the person who wants the items.**
- **Refer a donor to the website to have their item/s listed.**
